Phonics

Phoneme = **ee**

Introduce your child to this week's sound: **ee**

- Practise saying the sound
- Model letter formation for your child
- Write letter in the air
- Ask your child if they can think of any words with the 'ee' sound

- Practise saying 'ee' words. Try to break them down with your child to focus on the sounds e.g. d-ee-p.

Suggested spelling activities:

- Look at word, cover word, write word then check
- **Rainbow words** - write each letter of a word using a different colour. (Can be done outside using chalk)
- **Lego words** - build your words using Lego bricks. Other materials could be used.
- **Phonics hunt** - go for a hunt round your house to find any items featuring the 'ee' sound.
