Phonics

Phoneme = oo

Introduce your child to this week's sound: oo

- Practise saying the sound
- Model letter formation for your child
- Write letter in the air
- Ask your child if they can think of any words with the 'oo' sound
- Watch Geraldine the Giraffe Video: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-3UUnmNk1UM</u>
- Practise saying 'oo' words. Try to break them down with your child to focus on the sounds e.g. f-oo-d.

look	pool

Suggested spelling activities:

- Look at word, cover word, write word then check
- Flashcards make your own colourful flashcards to practise your words with.
- Sand/Foam with your finger, write your words in sand or shaving foam
- Phonics hunt go for a hunt round your house to find any items featuring the 'oo' sound.
