Focus on 4 words from this list per week.</p>

## Phonics

Phoneme = ll

Introduce your child to this week's sound: ll

1. Watch Mr Thorne Does Phonics:

2. Practise saying the sound

3. Model letter formation for your child to copy

4. Write letter in the air

5. Ask your child if they can think of any words with the 'll' sound

6. Practise saying and writing 'll' words. Try to break them down with your child to focus on the sounds e.g. t-e-ll.

### Suggested Activities:

1. Look at word, cover word, write word then check.
2. **Rainbow words** - write each letter of a word using a different colour.
3. **Sentences** - write a sentence for each of your words e.g. I have four dogs.
4. **Phonics hunt** - Go on a hunt to find any items featuring the 'll' sound.
