Rowling!</p>	<p>https://cdn.oxfordowl.co.uk/2019/01/28/16/25/45/913/2019_500Words_StoryIdeaGenerator.pdf</p> <p>Success criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Include an exciting opener -Use a variety of wow words (you can use an online thesaurus to help up level your vocabulary) -Develop main characters by including detailed descriptions, thoughts, feelings, a little bit of direct speech -Create a clear setting, you can do this by considering the five senses and using a range of figurative language (similes, metaphors, personification, onomatopoeia, assonance, alliteration, etc) -Ensure your story has a clear structure (set up, rising action, climax, conclusion) -Proof read your work (focus on spelling, grammar, punctuation and tense)
