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Climate action week

With COP26 (the UN Climate Change Conference) taking place in Glasgow in November this year, and the increasing need for us to take action on Climate Change, our P5-7 classes will be participating in Climate Change Action Week workshops provided through Keep Scotland Beautiful. The workshops will be delivered online during the week of 13th September and will help our learners understand what Climate Change is and its impact, how we are contributing to this situation and how we can contribute to its solution.



All classes will have the opportunity to engage in Global Citizenship/Sustainability topics in term 2.

Children's Rights

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, or UNCRC, sets out rights that all children are



entitled to covering all aspects of a child's life. It also explains how adults must work together to ensure all children can enjoy all their rights. In March 2021, the Scottish Parliament passed a bill that will make children's rights part of the law in Scotland.

All classes have begun to discuss children's rights looking at what is important to us and how both adults and children can work together to uphold children's rights. Each class has discussed and designed a class charter to show collective responsibility for children's rights.

Once our Pupil Council is established, we will be asking them to contribute to discussions around a wider school charter.

<u>SeeSaw</u>

We will continue to use SeeSaw this session to communicate with families about the work we have being doing in class and provide school/class updates. Class newsletters will also be shared on SeeSaw next week. We have had great uptake on this platform however if you require any sign-in details etc. please do not hesitate to contact the school office.

Outdoor walks

Each class will participate in an initial outdoor walk to a local area (e.g. The Plum, Acre Valley Woods, Fairy Glen, Fairy Trail etc.) on the following days:

P1 and P2 children will participate in weekly walks this term – more information to follow on SeeSaw.

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Torrance Early Years Centre

The children in our early years setting have been enjoying the freedom and flexibility of exploring the nursery environment without the restriction of bubbles! As a result of this, we have been adapting the learning environment to ensure children have the opportunity to explore a wider range of resources and provocations.

The children are also visiting the school gym hall on Mondays and Fridays, and the library on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Over the following weeks we will be focusing on each of values to help children understand how we can demonstrate the values in our setting. We have also introduced Teddy Time to encourage regular use of our Torrance Teddies. The Teddies will be used to help explore new activities and to facilitate wellbeing check-ins within key worker groups.
