

After consultation with our parents, children and staff, our new EYC vision, values and aims have been finalised as follows:


Our vision:

"Growing together to be all we can be!"


Our values:

Love, Honesty, Kindness, Respect


Our Aims:

Equality and Equity: ensuring all our children are supported to grow and be all they can be.

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

The children in our early years setting are getting to know their new keyworkers. The children are also visiting the school gym hall on Mondays and Fridays and the library on Tuesdays and Thursdays during which time they will participate in music machine and PaThs.

Over the following weeks we will be focusing on each of our values to help the children understand how we can demonstrate the values in our setting. We will be sending out postcards to inform you if your child has displayed one of our values in the setting so keep your eyes peeled! Staff are observing the children and responding to their interests and needs and planning appropriate provocations to extend their learning.

We are asking children to bring clothing suitable for our ever changing weather as we often see 4 seasons in the day!

In the coming weeks we are looking for the children to participate in a health and wellbeing check in at self-registration. We will keep you updated as to how this will happen and what it will look like.

To ensure that children's belongings are safe we would be much obliged if you could encourage your child to keep personal toys at home.

Water is available for the children to drink at all times in the Early Years Centre. We would ask you please to not place water bottles in children's bags.

<u>"ALL ABOUT ME"</u>

In the Early Years Centre we have had a focus on "all about me and my family." Could you please provide your child with a family photo to be displayed in the Centre.

TALKING BOXES (PRE SCHOOLERS ONLY)

Could you please provide your child with an old shoe box containing a maximum of 4 meaningful items/photos. This will enable the children to share information about themselves and develop confidence when talking to their peers in a small group. Your child can bring in their "talking box" whenever it is complete. Please bring to the nursery up until 14th October.

LCFE

As a Language and Communication Friendly Environment Centre, we continue to work on the following indicators:

- A physical environment that enhances and promotes opportunities for speech language and communication for all pupils
- **CFE** 2. Adult talk that encourages and promotes participation from all learners
- 3. Adult interaction styles that are responsive to individual pupil needs
- 4. The use of supportive learning strategies to develop language and communication skills
- 5. The establishment can demonstrate a strong commitment to staff training and development to meet the speech, language and communication needs of all pupils.

WHAT ARE WE LEARNING?

Each month we will plan focussed learning experiences and outcomes for children. During September we will be concentrating on our nursery values of love, respect, honesty and kindness. If your child displays any of these values at home, please let us know. We will also be focussing on forward number word sequences. At home encourage your child to chant numbers e.g. when climbing the stairs. Our literacy focus will be fine motor control which encourages development of appropriate pencil grip. Activities to develop this can include tearing paper, twisting on/off bottle tops and pulling/squeezing playdough. Encourage your child to use their thumb and index finger or thumb and next two fingers.

Children develop strong physical, social and language skills, and above all self-esteem and respect for the great outdoors.
